- 1. A homeless man that we have built a relationship with over the course of 6 months finally obtained housing. His mom sent us a thank you card to thank us for the love, care, and concern we showed her son. She also said that we saved her son's life.
- 2. A refugee family from Afghanistan has been coming on a regular basis to receive assistance and over time we established a bond, despite the language barrier. The great news is that you don't have to speak the same language to communicate love. To express their appreciation, they prepared a delicious meal of lamb, rice, and potatoes. In addition, we were given handmade heart pins.
- 3. A young, homeless man stopped to look for some clothes and thanked us for helping him find a job. Confused, I asked, "How did we do that?" He then said, "Well you guys had a nice blazer and dress pants on the porch and I didn't have anything to wear to a job interview."
 - 4. A lady on the porch asked for prayer for her brother. Several few weeks later, she came back and told us that 3 days after we prayed, God intervened.
- 5. A lady who has been struggling with addiction, depression, and facing eviction came here because she "didn't know where else to go" and feels safe, loved, and cared for when she is here with us. I spent some time talking to her, crying with her, and offered to spend some time looking for housing options. When we talked the next day, she thanked me for being there for her and going the extra mile.
- 6. A family came for assistance and we asked if they wanted to join us for prayer as a staff. We gave them each the opportunity to say a prayer and the little boy said, "God, help us to love and not to hate." The entire staff was in tears after that. What a powerful and profound request, but yet it's so simple.
- 7. A man came to our food pantry and asked if we could help him and his family. He said that they were absolutely desperate and had nothing to feed their kids, and was contemplating stealing to provide. We told him, "No, absolutely not. You don't have to do that. Not on our watch."


